Boulia Swimming Pool Upgrade...

Following the summer season at the Boulia Swimming Pool an important maintenance and replacement program is being delivered.

The pool was needing frequent top-ups of water, with investigations identifying that the expansion joints were leaking. Following emptying of the Pool the joints across the length and width of the floor were cut clean and have been filled with a modern material that can withstand differential movements of the concrete shell (as illustrated in blue lines on the following photograph).

There were also concerns with the reliability of the filtration system that maintains the water quality. It was identified that the aged tanks needed to be replaced, and new ones are currently being installed.

As a safety measure a non-slip paint has been applied to the pool concourse areas.

The works are expected to be fully completed and pool operational before the traditional pool reopening across the holding of Camel Races in July.
